Conference Speakers

Prof. Tom Seeley

Thomas D. Seeley, biologist and writer, is a professor in the Department of Neurobiology and



behaviour at Cornell University. He teaches courses on animal behaviour and does research on the behaviour, social life, and ecology of honey bees. Tom is an avid beekeeper and began keeping bees while a high school student, when he shook a swarm into a box and brought it home. His scientific work is summarized in five books: Honeybee Ecology (1985), The Wisdom of the Hive (1995), Honeybee Democracy (2010), Following the Wild Bees (2016), and The Lives of Bees (2019). In recognition of his scientific contributions, he has been honoured by an Alexander von Humboldt Distinguished U.S. Scientist Award, awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship, and elected a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the German National Academy of Sciences. He is also recipient of the Golden Goose Award from the American Association of the Advancement of Science for his contributions to the development of the "Honey Bee Algorithm", which underlies the efficient operation of the Internet. He writes: "These awards are gratifying, but for me the most important prizes by far are the discoveries that I have made about the inner workings of honey bee colonies."

Assoc. Prof. **Deborah Delaney**

Deborah Delaney is an associate professor in the Department of Entomology and Wildlife



Ecology at the University of Delaware where she mentors graduate and undergraduate students working on various aspects of pollinator health and productivity.

She teaches Insects and Society, Apiculture, Pollination Ecology, Aquatic Entomology and Bridging Art and Science: Environmental Communication. She has over 20 years of experience working with pollinators, specifically honey bees and maintains between 50-100 colonies throughout Delaware, Pennsylvania and Maryland. Her research program has four main focal areas:

- 1. genetic identity and diversity of US honey bees;
- 2. temporal stability of pollinator populations;
- 3. best management solutions for creating sustainable managed pollinator populations;
- 4. pollinator nutrition and forage mapping.

Dr. Úna Fitzpatrick Úna Fitzpatrick has a PhD in botany. She worked on a project on the conservation of Irish bees before joining the National Biodiversity Data Centre in 2007. She is responsible for the plant, vegetation and pollinator work programmes of the Centre. She is the chair of the steering group that produced the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan 2015-2020 and oversees its implementation.

Juanita Browne Juanita Browne is Community and **Engagement Officer with** the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan. Juanita combined a degree in Zoology with a Masters degree in Media Studies and has a background in communications, print and natural history documentaries.



Prof. Iane Stout

Jane Stout is an Ecologist, and is Professor in Botany at Trinity College Dublin. She completed her PhD on bumble bee foraging ecology at



Southampton University in 1999 with Professor Dave Goulson, and she moved to Trinity in 2001, taking up a lectureship in 2003. Jane's research explores the relationships between plants, animals and people. She focuses on pollination ecology, exploring how interactions shape ecological processes at individual, community and ecosystem scales. She leads the Plant-Animal Interactions Research Group at Trinity, which addresses global challenges associated with climate change, food security, biodiversity conservation and human health. Jane's work evaluates drivers of pollinator decline, explores the value of pollination to society, and provides the evidence-base for national conservation strategies. She is co-lead of the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan. which relies on this underlying research. Since 2016, Jane has co-led the Irish Pollinator Research Network, an interdisciplinary group that conducts topical research to inform policy. By disentangling the relationships between pollinators and habitat management, her research contributes to the development of sustainable landscapes and livelihoods across the world.

Conference Speakers Continued...

Flemming Vejsnæs

Flemming Vejsnæs is Beekeeper adviser for the Danish Beekeepers Association. Biologist and beekeeper himself.



For the past 30 years the focus has been on diseases and practical varroatreatment in the organic way, keeping Danish honey as a high value product. He is very focused on the quality and importance of the queen in a colony. As he said: "Beekeepers need to take part in varroa tolerance work in the future".

Flemming is a globetrotter in the sense of beekeeping. Visiting congresses and beekeepers all over, to exchange ideas and get inspired. Enjoying the hospitality of beekeepers. He is involved in the international COLOSS network, focusing on the widespread losses of colonies in the last 10 years worldwide.

Flemming started his beekeeping career in 1987. He has 25 colonies at present and is involved in advisory work for Danish beekeepers. He uses his experience with his own hives to challenge and update the advice he gives to beekeepers.

Latest project has been the development of a free hivelog program www.myhivelog.org and soon he will finish a bee disease app www.bisygdom.dk.

Keep bees alive, healthy and honey clean are the keywords for modern beekeeping.

Chris Hodges

Chris Hodges lives in Greyabbey on the Ards Peninsula where together with his wife Valentine they look after up to 100 colonies of native Irish Black Bees.

Chris has been keeping bees for 14 years and has forged very close links with the National Trust at Mount Stewart Estate who share the quest to develop the benefits of supporting indigenous species and they provide land to house several of their colonies including a teaching apiary. Indeed plans are "Afoot" to develop a visitors centre where subject to funding, members of the public and special interest groups can safely watch the bees and the beekeepers interacting together.

With such a lot of bees Chris has had the opportunity to work very closely with the colonies and take time to reflect on the lessons that we can learn from the occupants and practices of the hive. Chris plans to share these observations in his presentation at Greenmount.

When not looking after their bees Valentine and Chris are involved with youth work, scuba diving and teaching both the preliminary and intermediate beekeeping syllabus. Together they work every week in a local prison teaching and mentoring an enthusiastic group of both resident and staff students keen to understand the world of our honeybee.

UBKA Conference 202

Mark Wallace

Mark is from County Tyrone and is affiliated to Three Rivers Beekeepers' Association, a fledgling club with a membership of 100, located on the Tyrone -County Donegal border. Mark would say

he performs many roles in his Association,

the chief one being 'bee problem fixer'.

Mark began beekeeping as a teenager, helping manage a number of badtempered colonies, and from this realised the importance of having a gentle, productive dark strain - a trait he endeavours to maintain in his own colonies through selective queen rearing. He has been making his own equipment since the age of 16, having served an apprenticeship as a joiner. Mark has been heavily involved in teaching at preliminary and intermediate level at his Association and especially enjoys the hands-on side of tutoring in the field. He has a particular interest in heather honey, migrating a number of colonies to the ling heather most years. He regularly takes his produce to Honey Shows up and down the country collecting prizes along the way. Mark realises that at the end of the day, it's all about the bees as they are the ones who do all the hard work.

Saorla Kavanagh

Saorla Kavanagh graduated from Blanchardstown Institute of Technology in 2010 with a BSc in



Horticulture. She then went to Trinity College Dublin and obtained a firstclass degree in Botany in 2012. She completed her PhD at DCU, on "Honey chemical constituents from apiaries in different landscapes in Ireland", supervised by Blánaid White and co-supervised by lane Stout. She worked on the EPA-funded POLLIVAL project, which involved developing and accessing methodologies to evaluate pollination services in an economic context. She is currently the Project Manager on the Protecting Farmland Pollinators EIP Project in the National Biodiversity Data Centre. Saorla is a beginner beekeeper with expertise in the fields of chemistry and ecology.

Nigel Semmence

Nigel Semmence is a Contingency Planning and Science Officer for the National Bee Unit. Animal and Plant Health Agency.



Nigel started beekeeping whilst he was a teenager in Norfolk learning from his uncle and grandfather who were both bee farmers. After university Nigel worked in scientific sales before joining the Oxford Bee Company where he worked for three years on pollination projects in the UK and California using solitary bees. In 2009 Nigel joined the National Bee Unit (NBU) as Regional Bee Inspector (RBI) for Southern region running a team of seven Seasonal bee inspectors (SBIs). In 2015 Nigel became the Contingency planning and science officer for the NBU with responsibility for developing contingency plans for exotic pests and diseases of honeybees such as the Asian hornet, Small hive beetle and Tropilaelaps mites. Nigel is also involved closely with Defra policy colleagues and stakeholders (BBKA, WBKA, BFA, BBVA, etc) as a member of the Bee Health Advisory Forum.

Prof. Dara Kilmartin

Dara Kilmartin is a hobbyist beekeeper with 10 years experience managing 20-30 colonies in 6 apiaries between central and suburban Dublin, rural Wexford and a remote island in Connemara. He is a Beemaster and was awarded the CFL qualification of FIBKA in 2016 following exam lectures on Bee Stings and Bee Vision. He is the Bee Health Officer of the County Dublin Beekeepers Association and is an active member of the Native Irish Honey Bee Society. He regularly gives pollen microscopy workshops and bee dissection/disease analysis and has attended most NDB short courses. Particular beekeeping interests include bee diseases, pollen nutrition effects on bee immunity and comparative bee vision.

In his day job Dara is a Consultant Eye Surgeon.

Sam Clawson

Sam Clawson has worked for 40 years in the Department of Agriculture and AFBI mostly in the Entomology Department monitoring forestry pests, invertebrate vectors of disease and environmental health pests. He has provided a disease diagnosis service for beekeepers for many years.

Ivan Forsythe

Ivan Forsythe carries out a honey bee pest and disease diagnostic service for Northern Ireland. He is also responsible for reporting test results to DAERA bee inspectors and beekeepers, preparation and distribution of an annual honey bee husbandry survey questionnaire for Northern Ireland beekeepers and collaboration with COLOSS (a European honey bee research organisation), as part of a Europe-wide bee health survey.













